





# ANNUAL MEETING

3 Y 4 DE ABRIL - CDMX







On **April 3 and 4,** the XXI Annual Meeting of the Inter-American Chamber of National Associations of Shipping Agents (CIANAM) was held in Mexico City. On this occasion AMANAC (Mexican Association of Shipping Agents) hosted the event.

Delegates from the National Associations of Argentina, Brazil, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Mexico, Panamá, Perú, Paraguay, the United States and Uruguay, as well as local authorities and companies from Mexico's maritime and port sector attended.



During the opening ceremony, a welcome message was delivered by Mr. Fernando Con y Ledesma, President of the Mexican Association of Shipping Agents (AMANAC), Mr. Alejandro Malagón Barragán, President of the Confederation of Industrial Chambers of the United Mexican States (CONCAMIN), Dr. Mónica Ageitos, President of the Inter-American Chamber of National Associations of Shipping Agents (CIANAM), Mr. Fulvio Carlini, President of the Federation of National Associations of Brokers and Shipping Agents (FONASBA), Mr. Alejandro Habib Nicolás, Director of Business Integration Programs of the Ministry of Economy, and to conclude the inauguration was led by Admiral José Barradas Cobos, Undersecretary of the Navy of the Secretariat of the Navy - Mexican Navy.

Within the framework of the XXI Annual Meeting of CIANAM 2025, delegates made presentations together with the authorities of the different member countries, key spaces for dialogue and collaboration among maritime trade stakeholders in the Americas.

#### Economy, Growth and Maritime Development of the Brazilian delegation:



During the afternoon, the topics discussed were:






## Economy, Growth and Maritime Development of the Peruvian delegation:

products and its impact on regional trade.





The Uruguayan delegation emphasized its commitment to diversification and investment in port infrastructure, highlighting its strategic location to become a Hub port.


FAt the end of the presentations, the exhibitors were recognized for their outstanding participation.
